Professor of Christian Origins and Second Temple Judaism at King's College London, Joan has authored numerous books and articles about Jesus and his world, notably The Immerser: John the Baptist within Second Temple Judaism (1997), Jesus and Brian: Studying the Historical Jesus via Monty Python's Life of Brian (2015) and What did Jesus look like? (2018). She has studied questions of women and gender for many years, and has edited, with Ilaria Ramelli, Patterns of Women's Leadership in Early Christianity (2021). She also works in radio, television and film.

Persecuted, beaten and imprisoned in her home country of Zimbabwe for pursuing her conscience, Martha remains passionate about her culture. She is particularly interested in how 43 years of a postcolonial country has shaped women's lives and identity in Zimbabwe. What does a paternalistic society look like in 2023? She met her husband Dave in the UK and took him to see her village. 'My father's house had been destroyed under Mugabe's "Operation Restore Order" and everything was upside down and my children had nowhere to sleep. I took Dave to the villages which had no electricity, toilets or anything. He had never seen poverty in that context, and that was the beginning of the Love Zimbabwe Charity.'

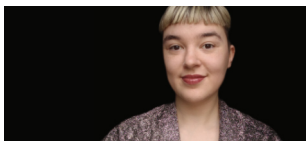

Her latest books are *The Time is Now: a call for uncommon courage* (2019) and *The Monastic Heart: 50 simple practices for a contemplative and fulfilling life* (2021).

### **Dr Mary McAleese - Rome**

President of Ireland from 1997 until 2011, Mary was the first President to come from Northern Ireland where she and her family experienced first-hand the sectarian violence of The Troubles. The theme of her presidency was Building Bridges and her work for peace and reconciliation culminated in the historic state visit to Ireland by HM Queen Elizabeth II in May 2011. She has been a leading critic of Catholic Church teaching on, among other things, women, homosexuality, Church members' human rights, children's rights, corporal punishment, church governance and episcopal accountability. She is a broadcaster, author, academic lawyer and has a licentiate and doctorate in Canon Law from the Pontifical Gregorian University. She is, amongst other things, current Chancellor of Trinity College Dublin and Chair of the Ansari Institute for Global Engagement with Religion, Notre Dame. She was a founder member of Ireland's successful Campaign for Homosexual Law Reform.

### **Steven T Newcomb - Bristol**

A Shawnee scholar, Steven is director of the Indigenous Law Institute, which he founded with traditional Oglala Lakota headman Birgil Kills Straight (1940-2019). He is also the director of Original Nations Advocates and has been writing about U.S. Federal Indian Law and Policy and the Doctrine of Discovery and Domination for some four decades. His work focuses on the contrast between the free existence of Indigenous nations extending back to the beginning of time, and the system of domination that was brought by ship across the Atlantic Ocean and imposed on everyone and everything. There is an additional contrast between the ecological and beneficial wisdom of Indigenous peoples, and the patterns of dehumanization used for centuries against them on the basis of the Vatican papal documents and royal charters. Steven published many of his findings in *Pagans in the Promised Land: Decoding the Doctrine of Christian Discovery* (2008), and he is co-producer of *The Doctrine of Discovery: Unmasking the Domination Code*, directed by Sheldon Wolfchild (Dakota).

Tom has been directly involved with clerical sexual abuse since 1982 and his involvement includes pastoral/spiritual support for victims and their families, canonical advocacy, consultant and expert witness in civil and criminal litigations. Ordained a priest in 1970, he spent 19 years as a chaplain in the US Air Force, worked as a parish priest, church administrator and teacher, and became a certified addictions therapist and canon lawyer. ### **Brian Devlin**

Author Brian was ordained to the priesthood in 1985. During his time in seminary he was abused by his Spiritual Director, later Cardinal Keith O'Brien. Once his abuser was appointed Archbishop Brian knew that he would be unable to stay in the ministry. He left the ministerial priesthood to work with AIDS/HIV sufferers. Brian was one of a group of priests who whistleblaw about the predations of the Cardinal as he was about to attend the conclave which appointed Pope Francis. He wrote Cardinal Sin: Challenging Power Abuse in the Catholic Church in 2021.
